## President's Message

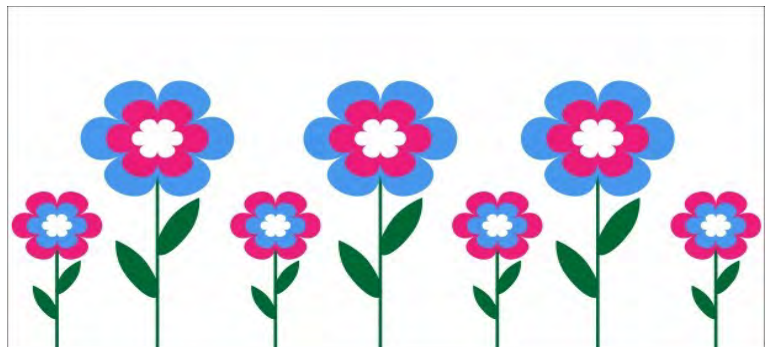
Greetings fellow quilters,

**INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER****PATTY CARR**

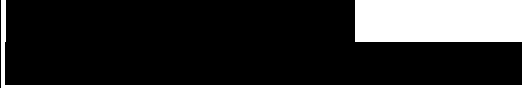
