INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER JUDY GARCIA


ATTENTION QUILTERS



Chemo Caps

Chemo Cap Outreach & Recap

It has been interesting seeing chemo caps sewn and then returned to be distributed to various community agencies. Unlike in years past when the chemo caps were given to only STARS, this year I also offered the caps to Hospice, ATCAA (Amador-Tuolumne Community Action Agency and Sierra Wind. STARS was unable to accept the chemo caps this year due to Covid restrictions so my thought was, why not offer them to agencies that work with the homeless or those who work with the dying? And that's what I did but only 29 caps were given out. I will try again to offer the caps to these agencies this coming year.

I looked over the records for chemo caps made and distributed in 2020 and 2021. In 2020 the quilt guild met only 6 times during the year, yet 192 chemo caps were made and 159 were given to STARS. Then last year 2021, 350 chemo caps were made (most in a workshop) but only 100 were given to STARS which left 250 caps in storage. And now this year STARS told me they have plenty of caps which they still aren't allowed to give to their clients, so please don't bring more. 2022 was a slow year for making chemo caps. Only 81 adult caps and 4 children caps were made. However, with the number of chemo caps I have in storage I have plenty to give away.

Here is my thought: Why not make some fleece blankets for the homeless and needy? I have 3 totes crammed full of uncut fleece. I'd like your feedback about this. Or if members are interested, we could have a chemo cap making workshop one month.

I wish everyone a blessings-filled New Year!


