INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER, SANDY ASKIN

SGQG: Where were you born?

SA: I was born in Oakland CA but when I was 9 months old my family moved to Massachusetts. When I was 6 years old, we moved to Oahu, Hawaii. After I was married, we moved to Milpitas and that's where we lived until we moved to Pine Grove.

SGQG: Are you married and do you have children?

SA: Yes, I've been married 53 years. I have 3 sons, 3 granddaughters and a 14 year old great granddaughter.

SGQG: What did you retire from?

SA: I was a teacher's aid, and I worked for TruValue Hardware but found my true calling as a Set Designer for a youth theater, which I did for 11 years. All the power tools in my garage belong to

me. I designed, built, painted and set all the scenes for the plays at the theater. When I set the stage, it was earthquake proof. (Actually went through a earthquake and my designs were still standing). I even painted the Mona Lisa for one of the sets.

SGQG: How long have you been a member of SGQG?

SA: I've been a member for about 13 years and have been quilting the same. I've been managing the dog bed donations for about 5 years.

SGQG: What's the best and hardest part of quilting.

SA: I love finding the perfect meaningful fabric to personalize a quilt. I volunteer at the Interfaith Food Bank Thrift Store, which allows me first pick of donations. I also create gift baskets for the Store. I love putting together a basket, which will take me a few weeks to make it perfect. Don't ask to break the basket apart and sell the items separately because I put my heart into every basket. I feel the hardest part of quilting is the actually quilting. It take a certain skill set and I give props to Pat Bjerke for her talent in quilting.

SGQG: Do you have other hobbies?

Yes, I also paint with oils. I make totes for my new church members also, I make microwave SA: bowls, which my son reminds me can also be used for ice cream. I've made Victorian pillows and enter one at the Fair and received First Prize. One year I made 80 bibs out of colorful fabrics for our community donations.



Open to Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado & Tuolumne Counties

FORMS & FEES DUE BY: Friday, July 8th, 4 pm Entries in Place: Saturday, July 23rd, 10 am – 4 pm in POKERVILLE HALL Entries Judged: Sunday, July 24th, 9 am (Open Judging)

Quilts need to be picked up Monday, August 1st, 10 am - 4 pm

QUILTS

Due to space constraints, any non-placing "KING SIZE" Quilts may not be hung, but displayed to the best of our ability. Thank You for Your Understanding.

QUILTING RULES:

- A. The exhibitor must have home produced all entries in this Department within one year of the opening date of the Fair to be eligible for premium awards.
- B. Quilts: All quilts must have a 4-inch sleeve for hanging and display purposes.
- C. Cleaned and Pressed: Soiled articles will be disqualified, and will not be displayed.
- D. Quilts need to be picked up Monday, August 1, 2022 10 am 4 pm
- E. Group Quilts: If any part of the quilt (piecing, quilting, appliqueing, etc.) was completed by anyone other than the exhibitor in whose name the quilt was entered.
- F. Perimeter: The perimeter is the outer edge measurement of the quilt.
- G. Quilt Sizes-
 - 1. Small- No larger than 216"
 - 2. Medium: 217"-299"
 - 3. Large: 300"
- H. Item must have been completed within the last year.

QUILT JUDGING CRITERIA:

- 1. Workmanship (including finishing)
- 2. Design Elements (balance, color, contrast & unity)
- 3. Technical Elements (technique or multiple techniques)
