INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER SANDY WAGNER

SGQG: Where were you born?

SW: Glendale California and I moved to Pine Grove 52 years ago.

SGQG: Do you have any children?

SW: Yes I have three girls and I've insisted they all learn to sew.

SGQG: When did you start sewing?

SW: When I was a girl, I would sew clothes for my Storybook Dolls with the fabric my father would bring home from his work. He would make diplomas and bring home taffetas and tapestries. I would also sew my children's clothes as well as my own.

SGQG: Bring one of the founding members of the SGQG, what's the biggest change?

SW: The biggest change I've noticed is the lack of cohesiveness of the group. I'd love to see some of the quilters come up from traditional quilts to art quilting. I've repurposed some of my traditional quilts to wearable art and embellish them using couching, Shibori and pole dyed fabrics. I call these pieces "rebirth". When I turned 50, I decided I didn't need anymore bed size quilts and now make smaller art quilts now. We started with 25 members for our first year and by the second years, had 8 members. I think some members thought quilting wasn't for them. We've meet all over the county, including Sutter Creek, Sutter Hill but mostly here in Pine Grove. I was also president for 3 years and have held every office on the board over the years.

SGQG: What other hobbies do you have?

SW: I also knit, golf, travel and sing. I was part of a 8 part harmony quartet for 44 years. I also did walking scores for the PGA and the LPGA. But, I haven't' played golf for the last two years now, ever since I broke my wrist. I'm a certified scuba diver. I owned a quilt shop called A Quilted Experience from 1985 to 1987.

SGQG: Where's the best place you've traveled and the least favorite?

SW: Africa was the best. You can travel a little out of town and go back in time 200 years. My least would be China. I did not appreciate the lack of western bathrooms.

SGQG: Are you a member of any other associations?

SW: Yes, I'm a member of Studio Art Quilt Association which is International. I've taken Zoom classes with other members all over the world. Including Germany, Dubai, the Netherlands. We have over 8000 members world wide. I have a blog: www.sandralwagnersart.me.


