INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER DEBBY SWEETEN

SGQG: Where were you born?

SGQG: In your opinion, what's the best and worst parts of quilting.



October Community Quilt Workshop Fence Rail Nine Patch Exchange

At our September meeting I suggested a group project for our October community quilt workshop on Wednesday. For those who missed the meeting, here are the options. If you would like to participate, I am calling this project the Fence Rail Nine Patch Exchange. This will be a fun way to use up scraps, whether your own or the guild's! If you don't have scraps, Community Service will have fabric at our Tuesday's guild business meeting to use also.

Those who want to participate: cut 2 inch strips. Sew two strips of similar colors together. Press (to one side or open seam your choice.) Please check your ¹/₄" seam allowance!

Cut the strips in 3-1/2 inch increments. Bring these blocks to Wednesday's workshop. We will exchange blocks to get variety in our finished blocks. If you can't get the blocks done by Wednesday, you can work on them at the workshop too.

Each block will have 9 fence rail blocks to make one block. The FINISHED size of the fence rail blocks is 3"x3". Sashing will be strips of 2 ½". Your choice will be sashing all the same or to add cornerstones.

We will sew blocks on Wednesday. This is entirely voluntary. If you have a different community quilt project you want to work on that is fine too.

TIPS AND TRICKS

CHAIN-PIECING

Stack pieces to be sewn in pairs, with right sides facing. Join the first pair as usual but DO NOT cut thread or lift the presser foot at the end of the seam. Just feed the next pair of pieces, and the next, and the next, making a few stitches between the pieces so the seams don't unravel. Now clip the threads between the pair.

BORDERS

Cut borders from the lengthwise grain of your fabric before any other pieces are cut.

SELECTING FABRIC

Choose a SMALL PRINT fabric with no more then two colors, when selecting fabric for small pattern pieces. Multi-color fabrics will look muddy. Very small pieces work best in solid colors.
