
During my absence if you have guild questions or issues please direct them to one of the other board members.

INTERVIEW WITH GUILD MEMBER MARY FOSTER

SGQG: How long have you lived in this area?

MF: I moved to California when I was 5 years old with my mother and lived in Manteca until I went to college. My husband Phil and I moved to Amador County in 1998.



SGQG: Wow! That's a long time.

MF: Yes, Phil has kids in the area and that's what drew us here.

SGQG: Have any other kids?

MF: Yes, all together Phil has 3 kids, 5 grandchildren and 8 grandbabies with one more on the way.

SGQG: What did you study in college?

MF: I received a degree in home economics but realized I did not want to teach but found myself drawn to library sciences. I received my Masters in library sciences about the same time we moved to this area.

SGQG: Do you have other hobbies?

MF: Yes, I've been knitting since high school. I also like to back pack as well as fly fish.

SGQG: Where's the best place you've back packed?

MF: Yes, I hand quilt a lot of my quilts. I also use a serpentine stitch on the quilts I donate to our guild.

SGQG: What's the best and least favorite part of quilting?

MF: Best for me is the hand quilting. It's gives me a sense of satisfaction and relaxation. I would say the least favorite part is when my vision doesn't come to pass. Hindsight is 2020 I guess.

Our Quilt Show is quickly approaching. Have you designed your Vignette yet? They will make a statement about your quilt as well as enhance the overall look of our show. Drape a bucket with a fabric that is coordinating color of your quilt and set a pot of greenery or flowers on top of it. It can be that simple. Photographs, yard art, stuffed animals, plants, small stands, small chairs- there is no end to what you can use. Make sure all items are identified with your name and entry number. Fragile items or items of value are discouraged.

Also, consider safety: no tripping hazards, small items children could choke on, etc. Bring your vignette items on Wednesday, October 5 with your quilts beginning at 9:00 am. Place them behind the pole between Pokerville Hall and The Spur building. There will be a sign. At the close of the show everyone will help bring all the vignette items to the same

pole for you to pick up. If you don't care to make vignette, I will be glad to. If any of the items, I have brought to Guild interest you, I would be glad to loan them to you. Please call me if you are looking for a certain item or just need an idea to get started.
